



Volunteer Task Force



After the April 29 Town Meeting where several 2013 targets for Mount Olive were discussed, I have formed the Volunteer Task Group with about a dozen people involved (and we are always open to having more input since this is a "think tank" type of group). We had our first formal meeting June 3 at 9:30 AM.

There are several things we will do as a task group over the next several months to a year, but the one we are focusing on right now is to find Mount Olive's "Kingdom Concept."

What does that mean? We will be looking at the demographics of the area we are in as well as the makeup of Mount Olive (what resources and talents we have) to find a *unique* area of ministry we can serve in for our community.

What does this have to do with • volunteering? Well, once we see a particular need and know that we have something unique

to offer, then we can clearly state what we need volunteers for and how they can serve.

We are getting area demographics, looking at stats of Mount Olive, driving around the neighborhoods and asking people questions all to find out our unique way we can serve our community. So, we need your input!

- When you think about
 Aurora and the surrounding area what things come to mind? How would you describe Aurora?
- When you think of Mount
 Olive what things come to mind? If you were to describe Mount Olive to

someone who has never visited us what would you share?

We would like specific answers to these questions from YOU! There is no right or wrong – this is your opinion, and we want it! It will help us start getting a picture of who we are and where God has placed us, which will then help us see what we need to do. Over the past couple of weeks many of you have responded to the survey about how you would describe Aurora and Mount Olive. Thank you to those who did respond with great and detailed responses! This information will be helpful for the Volunteer Task Team to see what people are thinking about our area and church and to think of ways God may use us to bring the message of hope to our community.

I have also been having fun using your responses in a creative way to help see what is important. I took all the responses to what

people thought about Mount Olive and plugged them into the web site wordle.com to come up with a word picture or word cloud. What is a word cloud? It is a visual way of seeing words that come up more often than others and representing them as larger or smaller in a cluster of words. So what happened when I put in the responses – well you can see it in the picture above. And look at the word that stands out! PEOPLE! (To be perfectly open, the words Olive, Mount and Mt since they did occur more often but since they were just "rephrasing" the question it was good to remove these words for better results.)

On July 20, 2012 our community was shocked by a horrific event, the shooting at the Century 16 Theater. With 12 dead and many people injured, some severely and with the trauma caused to many people in the theater and the people who responded to help and to our whole community, we are in need of hope and comfort and assurance. And what is God's Word filled with for us? Hope, comfort and assurance in Jesus. And what are we called to do as the body of Christ? Share the hope, comfort and assurance of Christ. And how do we best do this? People connecting with people.

Do you see why I think it was great that "People" was the most used word in the word cloud? Our whole ministry at Mount Olive must be about people! We can have a great building, great worship, great music, great resources – but it all has to be about connecting PEOPLE with Jesus. People is our number one priority – and actually to go beyond that I believe it is the people outside our walls, our Mount Olive community that we need to be focused on. Yes we do take care of ourselves too – but God's hope, comfort and assurance is in our lives already – how about us sharing it with a community that needs it. And with the tragedy at the theater, now is a time that PEOPLE's hearts are open to hearing about the hope, comfort and assurance we have in Jesus. So let's be about connecting PEOPLE to Jesus!

P.S. I think it is neat that another word that came up often was "friendly" because we will need to be open and friendly to reach out to people hurting!

Confirmation 2012-2013

It is that time of year again for Confirmation to start. Confirmation is for our 6th-8th graders and it is a time of learning and growing in their faith as they become young men and women.

Instruction takes place Wednesday evenings from 7 -8:30 PM at Mount Olive. The structure of our time together includes whole group instruction, small group interaction and other activities to help our youth have a fun, engaging and learning opportunity. Our first event is Wednesday, August 29, 7 PM which is a Family Covenant Night. All parents and youth need to attend this night where more information about the program will be presented as well as a meaningful family worship service together.

Wanderers

On Friday, August 24, the Wanderers depart Mount Olive at 9 AM for a self-guided tour and lunch at Miramont Castle Museum at Manitou Springs. Two chair lifts are available for those who find steps difficult. In the afternoon we will visit Seven Falls, the only waterfall in Colorado to make the National Geographic list of International Waterfalls. An elevator provides a fantastic view of the falls! We will return approximately 5:30 PM. Cost of \$45 includes transportation, lunch and admissions.

The Wanderers will see the 40 by 60 foot "Great Map of Colorado" embedded in the terrazzo floor of the atrium as we begin our tour of The History Colorado Center on **Friday, September 28**. The new museum at 1200 Broadway opened April 28. Depart Mount Olive at 9:15 AM and return approximately 2 PM. Lunch on your own in the Rendezvous Café in the museum. Cost is \$10 for transportation and tour.

On **Friday, October 26**, the Wanderers depart Mount Olive at 9 AM to visit Longhopes Donkey Shelter at Bennett, which began in 1999. Lunch will follow at Lulu's. \$12 includes tour and transportation. Return approximately **2** PM.
