### Cookie Cans

**Cookie Cans for College Students – 2012/13 School Year is off to a GREAT start! We sent out 14 cans on November 3. December 1 will be our CHRISTMAS mailing. There will not be a mailing in January because most kids are home.**

**are also sending cans to graduate and POST-four-year students!**

**We are asking** that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 25-30 cookies for each can. That's 14 cans times 25 cookies = 350 cookies per month or about 30 dozen, so **your help is needed and greatly appreciated.** If you don't have college age kids but love to bake, we also welcome and appreciate your contribution, too! 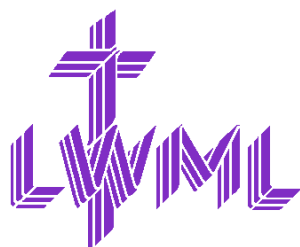

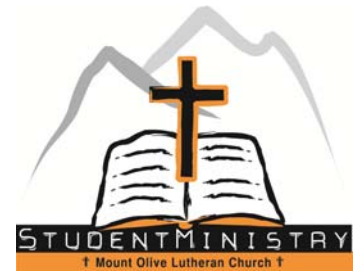

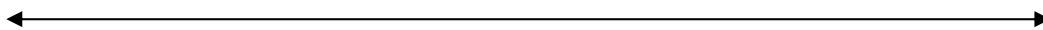
