## Where Do We Go From Here?

### Inside this issue:

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Many of you have been asking, "What is Mount Olive going to do with Pastor Shearier leaving as Senior Pastor?" That is a very good question and we want you to know that the Governing Board, Elders and Staff are working hard to not only maintain ministry but also reevaluate ministry. Here, briefly, is what is at work for Mount Olive:

- **We need your prayers!** Please continue to pray for Mount Olive and our ministry. In the future we will probably have some formal prayer times where we can come together and pray for the specific needs of Mount Olive and its ministry.
- **We need you!** As we go through this transition, we need to make sure that ministry happens and is of the highest quality. You can make that happen! What do you see that needs to happen? Are there needs not being met? Are there areas that could use more help? PLEASE step up and provide your help and assistance. Mount Olive is part of the Body of Christ which is more than just one, two or a handful of leaders—it is everyone pitching in where God has called them and placed them to serve.

When a congregation goes through a transition of leadership it is a good opportunity to evaluate the overall ministry and direction of the congregation (strengths, weaknesses, needs, opportunities, etc.). In the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod we have a ministry called Intentional

Interim Pastor to provide guidance for a limited time to help with the transition. The Governing Board, with guidance from the Elders and Staff, has decided this would be a good opportunity for Mount Olive to use the Intentional Interim Pastor to guide us in this transition.

**What is an Intentional Interim Pastor?** This person is a pastor with special training to help guide a congregation through a transition from one pastor to the next. They can be used in times when a pastor leaves or is removed because of inappropriate actions and in this case the congregation needs help in the healing process from the shock and hurt. Another reason, and the reason we are calling an Intentional Interim, is to help guide a congregation through reevaluating mission, ministry and vision to prepare and be energized for new directions in ministry. This person can give us an outside set of eyes to evaluate what we do well and what needs to improve or change in our ministry at Mount Olive. This is a very healthy and worthwhile step for Mount Olive to take. This person typically will serve for one year at a congregation and will have a specific end date to his contract.

A committee is forming to evaluate and recommend a candidate for our Intentional Interim which

will then be voted on by the congregation. We are working with the district for a list of names of those pastors *specifically trained* for this ministry. Our hope is to bring on this person as soon as possible. Once we have a recommendation, a voter's meeting will be held for the congregation to approve the Call for an Intentional Interim Pastor.

In this transition Pastor Mike will continue to be your pastor and feels called to Mount Olive and its ministry. Pastor Mike says, *While change is hard and saying goodbye to Pastor Shearier is sad, I truly believe God has big plans in store for Mount Olive in the future. I am dedicated to continuing and growing the ministry of Mount Olive and am excited about having an Intentional Interim Pastor who can help assess our congregation and give us fresh insights into making Mount Olive a healthy, thriving congregation. I am praying daily for Mount Olive and working with Staff, Governing Board, Elders and others to keep communication open and to foster a commitment to our mission of reaching, caring and building people toward maturity in Christ. Pastor Mike will oversee all of the pastoral duties and care and will share in those when we secure an Intentional Interim Pastor.*

Again, we need all of your involvement in this transition period and so if you have questions, comments, suggestions or just want to talk about "all this change," please feel free to contact Pastor Mike, the Governing Board or Elders.

On these days a coffee can filled with home-baked cookies, hot cocoa or cider mix and seasonal goodies will be mailed or delivered to each college student. Parents or students of Mount Olive submit student names and addresses each year to receive the cookie can.

**We are asking** that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 2-1/2 dozen cookies for each can, so your help is needed and greatly appreciated. If you just love to bake, we would also welcome and appreciate your contribution, too!

### Ways to be involved:

- ⇒ Bake cookies, wrap them in packs of two with cling wrap or in a snack-size baggie and bring them to church for packing.
- ⇒ Donate cocoa, cider mix, seasonal candy, granola bars, popcorn, pretzels, cheese crackers, nuts, raisins and other dried fruits, trail mix, rice cakes, Crystal Lite, cider, hot chocolate, ice tea and other drink packets, etc.
- ⇒ Donate for mailing costs. There is a coffee can on the Narthex table.
- ⇒ Come, help pack. It takes less than an hour and we have a great time working and catching up on what our college kids are doing.

**Several 'thank you' notes and emails** were received from students last year letting us know how much they enjoyed the cans of goodies and how it "gave them a nice break" from their studies to enjoy a "taste of home."

**Sign up sheets** will be placed on the Narthex table each month. We hope to have around 25 cans this year and at 2-1/2 dozen cookies per can we will need about 63 dozen cookies each month. If you have 2 lb or 3 lb coffee cans with lids, drop them off in the Church Office please! Students living at home can have their cookie can hand delivered but postage for the 'at school' group runs between \$6.50-\$8.00 depending on the size of the can. Monetary donations are accepted at any time and are GREATLY APPRECIATED. They can be given to the Church Office or placed in the cookie can on the Narthex table.

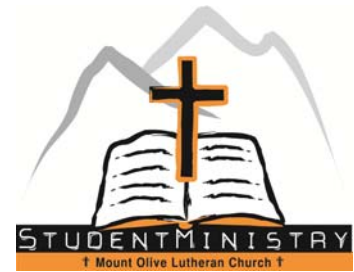

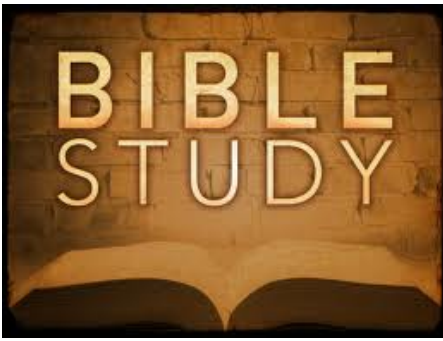

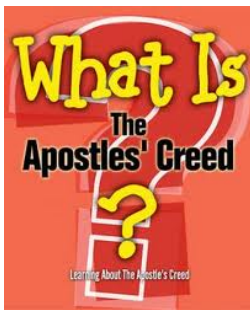

***How We Got the Bible and How Can We Use it***

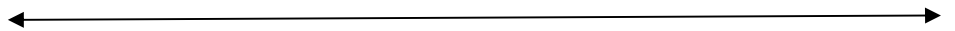

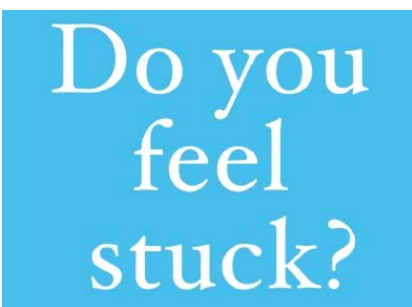
***The Apostles' Creed***
