Cookie Cans

Cookie Cans for College Students – 2012/13 School Year continues to be a great hit! Our next mailing is February 2.

It's not too late to receive a can – submit the name and address of your college age child to Kathy Pelepchan, 303.693.4161 OR email to kpelepchan@msn.com. We are also sending cans to graduate and POST-four-year students!



We are asking that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 25-30 cookies for each can. That's 14 cans times 25 cookies = 350 cookies per month or about 30 dozen, so **your help is needed and greatly appreciated.** If you don't have college age kids but love to bake, we also welcome and appreciate your contribution, too! Cookies can be frozen for future use at home and brought in that Saturday morning.

Make sure you WRAP the cookies and goodies in packets or two if large or four if small!!!

We also need donations of cider mix, hot cocoa packets, seasonal candy, granola bars, popcorn, pretzels, cheese/peanut butter-filled crackers, nuts, raisins and other dried fruits, trail mix, rice cakes, Crystal Lite, ice tea and/or other drink packets, etc.

Food Pantry

Human Care Ministry continues the "Helping Hands Care Package" to help families in need of short term assistance with food. (This is in addition to our efforts and support of Aurora Interchurch.) Please look for these items on sale or when shopping in bulk and donate items monthly as you are able to support this ministry for those in need. Through your generous support we have been able to assist up to 5 families per week and up to 3 individuals per week – that's over 32 people per month! To God be the glory!

Boxed: Potatoes, macaroni and cheese, powdered milk, cereals including oat-meal, snack bars; packs of ramen noodles

Canned: Stews, ravioli, chili, pork 'n beans, tuna, chicken, chicken noodle soup, beef or chicken with vegetables soup, tomato soup; peas, mixed vegetables, carrots; pears, pineapple, Mandarin oranges

Jars: Peanut butter, jelly

Paper: Paper towels, toilet tissue

Toiletries: Toothpaste, tooth brushes, hand sanitizer, shampoo, deodorant, bar soap

Mount Olive has ... *A Heart to Know God*

As we enter into the season of Lent (a time to reflect on the sacrifice Jesus paid for us) we can truly see the heart of God. As Jesus said in John 3:16—“For God so loved the world ...” God’s heart is filled with love for us, and it breaks His heart to see us stuck in our sin. God the loving Father sends Jesus to be “broken” for us. His loving sacrifice on the cross allows our broken relationship with God to be restored.

In our brokenness we often fear many things in this world, give in to things we shouldn’t and often run away from all that is bad instead of facing it with the power of the cross. Each Sunday we will explore ways we can face our brokenness and overcome it with the power of Jesus who died on the cross for us.

Sometimes we give up things for Lent to remind us that God gave His life for us—but our sacrifice is never adequate. So maybe instead of giving something up we can “add” to our lives ways that our hearts can know God and to fully embrace His love for us! It is time to receive God’s love and grace—to know His heart was broken for us so we are not broken, and to accept His unconditional love in our lives (and begin to show it to others—giving of your heart!).

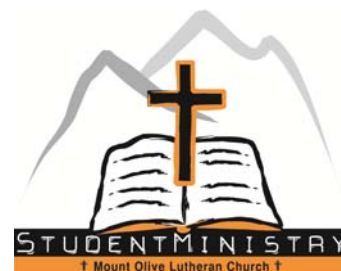

Although the exact author of this hymn is a mystery, the text was first printed in 1811. The hymnal was entitled *A General Selection of the Newest and Most Admired Hymns and Spirituals Songs Now In Use* and was compiled by a Methodist Episcopal pastor.

The tune *WONDRIOUS LOVE* was identified with this text in the 1840 publication of *Southern Harmony*. This hymnal made use of the shape note notation, where note heads carried information on pitches. An example of this shape note notation is shown on the right for your reference.

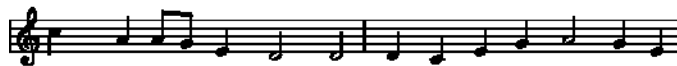
What Wondrous Love Is This invites the worshipper to ponder our Savior's great love, who bore the dreadful curse by "becoming sin for us" (2 Corinthians 5:21). 1 John 4:7-10 speaks of this love: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." Stanzas 3 and 4 take the hymn heavenward as they speak of the victorious Lamb of God (Revelation 5:6-13), the great I AM (John 8:58), who we will eternally praise in Heaven!

Mites

One of the Mission Grants your Mites supports is The Open Arms Institute. This Institute was incorporated in 1999 and has been granted status as a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod (LCMS). The Lutheran Women's Missionary League pledged the sum of \$65,000 at the Peoria Convention to help this organization establish new LCMS Word and Sacrament ministries in growing communities. Our Lord Jesus Christ said, "Let the little children come to me..." (Matthew 19:14), and then He took them up in His arms and blessed them! Many congregations are finding that a Christ-centered childcare ministry can bring them into personal contact with a much larger number of unchurched families in their communities, as they offer them childcare in a Christian setting.
