



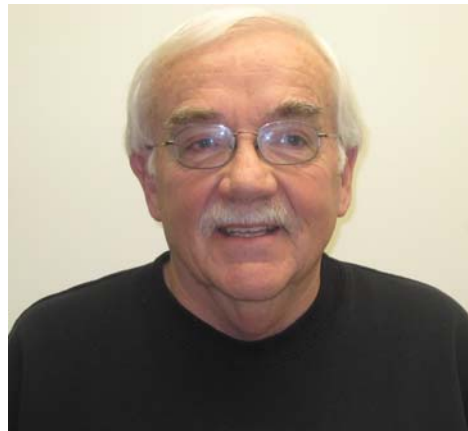

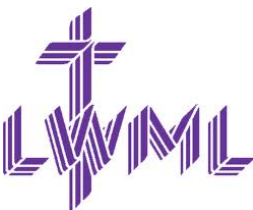
Have you ever wanted to take a mission trip but didn't have the money?

Preschool Praise and Play

This Summer, our preschool children will gather each Sunday in our preschool area for a Praise and Play experience. We will hear a story, sing God's praises, create a craft, and play with friends each Sunday. Children will go out to the playground and should dress accordingly. Our youngest children should be accompanied by an adult each week. Preschoolers will meet in the ECEC.

Elementary Faith and Friends

This Summer, our children, in Kindergarten through grade 4, will grow in faith through a Bible lesson and activity and grow in friendship through fun together. Children will go out to the "big kids" playground and should dress accordingly. Elementary kids will meet in Room 3 each week.

Volunteers are needed each Sunday to serve as a second adult. It is our policy to always have two adults present when serving our children. There is no preparation necessary to help in this way. However, volunteers do need to attend a risk management class and have a background check on file. Please talk to Robin if you are interested in serving in this manner. Those who have already taken the class and have a background check on file may sign up at the Children's Ministry Counter.

Sunday School Staff

Sunday School team teachers and substitute teachers are needed. Every class has two or more teachers. Teachers take turns teaching and share responsibility. Curriculum is provided.

Kid's Club Leaders

Kid's Club meets the first Wednesday of every month, from 6:00-7:00 PM. Volunteers will plan crafts, games, and stories. The children will be divided by age level and volunteers will work with one age group.

Praise & Play Helpers

Preschool Praise and Play meets Wednesday evenings from 6:00-7:00 PM. Volunteers help with supervision, set-up and clean-up, while showing God's love to His children. No preparation is involved in this position.

Faith Legacy Teachers

Volunteers are needed to lead each section of the Faith Legacy Series. Volunteers would commit to one age level and teach for one month. The curriculum is provided and no experience is necessary.

Family Service Club Leaders/Servers

Families with children of all ages (or no children at all) are invited to participate in our new service club. We will meet the first Sunday of each month and participate in a service project together. Volunteers are needed to coordinate the service projects and to serve lunch.

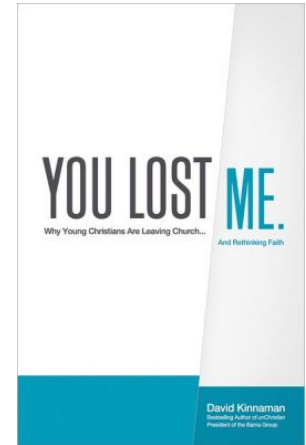

HYMN OF THE MONTH

We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God

LSB 941

In Christ, all believers are united and equal! This idea is confessed and expounded upon in the ancient hymn Te Deum Laudamus, which translates to “We praise You, O God” in English. The Te Deum hymn was written around A.D. 400 by a contemporary of St. Jerome. Our Hymn of the Month is a versification of the Te Deum prepared by Lutheran pastor and hymnwriter Stephen Starke. The tune Thaxted was written by English composer Gustav Holst. You may recognize the music from the main theme of the Jupiter movement from Holst’s orchestral suite “The Planets.”

The Te Deum text has been used in the church for 1,600 years, primarily during the Matins service, a service sung in the morning. Luther thought so highly of the Te Deum that he considered it equal with the creeds.

In the Te Deum all Christians are united to sing the same song. Here is a list, drawn from the Te Deum, of those praising God:

- All the earth
- Angels
- The heavens and all the powers in them
- Cherubim and seraphim
- The heavenly hosts
- Heaven and earth
- The glorious company of the apostles
- The goodly fellowship of the prophets
- The noble army of martyrs
- The holy church throughout all the world

As we sing this song, we promote and confess the belief that the church is united in our worship of Christ.

Every Christian of all times and all places (the church catholic) sings this same song: the song of salvation in Christ!

Wanderers

On **Monday, July 8**, the Wanderers journey to Loveland for a tour of the Wal-Mart Distribution Center, preceded by lunch at Nordy's Bar-B-Que and Grill (full menu, lite bites, and a \$10 buffet). We depart Mount Olive at 9 AM and return approximately 4 PM. \$7 includes tour and transportation. Our first stop will be at Chapungu Sculpture Park at Centerra ... the largest collection in America of stone sculptures (family oriented) from Zimbabwe (Africa) in a lovely cottonwood shaded park.

The front-range mountain town of Nederland is the destination for the Wanderers on **Friday, August 23**. "The Carousel of Happiness" in Nederland is the dream-come-true of a U.S. Marine fighting in the jungles of Vietnam. With 20 years of hand-carving and restoration and music provided by a fully restored, glass enclosed 1913 Wurlitzer Military Band Organ with amazing capacity to replicate the voices of 101 different band instruments, the 1910 carousel originally served at Saltair Amusement Park built

on piers in the Great Salt Lake in Utah. See it-hear it-ride it (optional). Depart Mount Olive at 9 AM and return approximately 3 PM. Cost is \$10 and lunch on your own at Black Forest Restaurant in Nederland.

Friday, September 20 the Wanderers journey to Colorado Springs to view "Passages" a touring exhibition that employs whiz-bang technology such as holograms and animatronics to explain the Bible. Hundreds of artifacts and texts from the Jewish, Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox faith traditions, including cuneiform tablets dating to the time of Abraham, first century B.C. Dead Sea Scroll fragments, first editions of the King James Bible and Torah scrolls that survived the Nazi Holocaust are featured. Depart Mount Olive at 8:30 AM and return approximately 5 PM. We'll visit the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy before going to lunch on your own at Patty Jewett Golf Course Restaurant. Cost of \$40 includes transportation, admissions, and lunch. Pre-pay to the Church Office by September 13.
