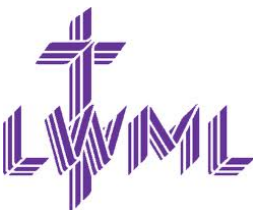
Your contribution of mites on *Green Sunday* helped LWML to meet our national goal!

HYMN OF THE MONTH

O Church, Arise

(by Townend & Getty)

O Church, Arise

Why do we sing hymns? "First, it's to help teach the faith...it's so important that we sing the whole scope of truth the Bible has given us." This isn't an answer given by leading Lutheran theologians or Biblical scholars. This response was given by a writer of "contemporary" songs, Keith Getty! In an age when many within the church would seek to dilute, confuse, or distort the Gospel message, Getty and other composers are boldly asserting the importance of Biblically grounded songs for worship. "It's been several hundred years since Christian worship was as shallow as it is today. Christianity is more universal than it's ever been, but people's understanding of their faith and the Bible is disappointing," says Getty.

Getty's hymn *O Church Arise* is our hymn of the month for June. Let's take a look at the text using the good Lutheran question, "What does this mean?"

Hymn Text

1. O Church Arise and put your armor on; Hear the call of Christ our Captain. For now the weak can say that they are strong, In the strength that God has given. With shield of faith and belt of truth, we'll stand against the devil's lies. An army bold, whose battle-cry is love, reaching out to those in darkness
2. Our call to war, to love the captive soul, but to rage against the captor; And with the sword that makes the wounded whole, we will fight with faith and valor. When faced with trials on ev'ry side, we know the outcome is secure. And Christ will have the prize for which He died, an inheritance of nations.
3. Come see the cross, where love and mercy meet, as the Son of God is stricken; Then see His foes lie crushed beneath His feet, for the Conqueror has risen. And as the stone is rolled away and Christ emerges from the grave, this vict'ry march continues till the day ev'ry eye and heart shall see Him.
4. So Spirit, come, put strength in ev'ry stride, give grace for ev'ry hurdle; That we may run with faith to win the prize of a servant, good and faithful. As saints of old still line the way, retelling triumphs of His grace, we hear their calls, and hunger for that day when, with Christ, we stand in glory.

What does this mean?

Wake up, people of God! Put on the armor of faith (Ephesians 6:11) to stand up against the attacks of the devil in this sinful world. God has given us His strength through the death and resurrection of Christ.

The church is Christ's hands and feet here on earth. Having received the forgiveness of sins, we love the other sin-captured souls here on earth and tell them the Gospel message. "Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth." (1 John 3:18)

Love and mercy are found in the death and resurrection of Christ, where He disarmed the demonic rulers and authorities "triumphing over them." (Colossians 2:15)

We ask for the Holy Spirit's strength and grace to "run with endurance the race that is set before us." (Hebrews 12:1) We are encouraged in our walk of faith by the lives of the saints of ages past. We look forward to our life with Jesus in heaven!

The Westminster Castle, also locally known as "The Big Red Castle" or "The Pillar of Fire" is a historic landmark in Westminster, CO. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it was completed in 1893 of red sandstone, an example of Richardsonian Romanesque architecture. The checkered history will be explained to the Wanderers on **Friday, June 7**, during a tour. Depart Mount Olive at 9:15 AM and return approximately at 2 PM. Cost \$5 includes tour and transportation. Lunch will follow the tour at a popular north Denver eatery.
