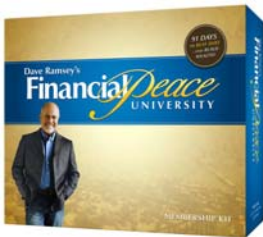

Cookie Cans for College Students – 2013/14 School Year

This year our cookie cans will be sent out on these Saturdays: 2013-October 5, November 2, December 7, and 2014-February 1, March 1 and April 5. On these days a coffee can filled with home-baked cookies, hot cocoa or cider mix and seasonal goodies will be mailed or delivered to each college student. Parents or students of Mount Olive submit student names and addresses each year to receive the cookie can.

If you or your child would like to receive a can, especially the new June 2013 graduates, please submit the name and address to Kathy Pelepchan, 303.693.4161 OR email to kpelepchan@msn.com. Names need to be submitted by September 28 for the October 5 mailing.

We are asking that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 2-1/2 dozen cookies for each can, so your help is needed and greatly appreciated. If you just love to bake, we would also welcome and appreciate your contribution too!

Ways to be involved:

- ⇒ Bake cookies and **PLEASE WRAP** them in packs of two with cling wrap or in a snack-size baggie and bring them to church for packing.
- ⇒ Donate cocoa, cider mix, seasonal candy, granola bars, popcorn, pretzels, cheese crackers, nuts, raisins and other dried fruits, trail mix, rice cakes, Crystal Lite, cider, hot chocolate, ice tea and other drink packets, etc.
- ⇒ Donate for mailing costs. There is a coffee can by the Pamphlet Rack.
- ⇒ Come and help pack. It takes less than an hour and we have a great time working together and catching up on what our college kids are doing.

Several 'thank you' notes and emails were received from students last year letting us know how much they enjoyed the cans of goodies and how it "gave them a nice break" from their studies to enjoy a "taste of home."

We hope to have around 15-20 cans this year and at 2-1/2 dozen cookies per can we will need about 50 dozen cookies each month. If you have 2 lb or 3lb coffee cans with lids (NO SMALLER, please), drop them off in the Church Office! Students living at home can have their cookie can hand delivered but postage for the 'at school' group runs between \$7.50-\$9.00 depending on the size of the can. Monetary donations are accepted at any time and are GREATLY APPRECIATED. They can be given to the Church Office or placed in the cookie can by the Pamphlet Rack. **Thank you so much for all your support and help!**

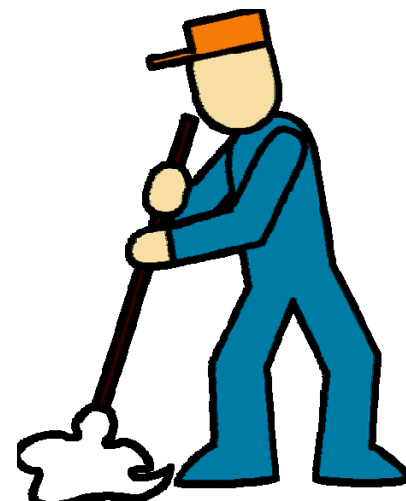
Thank You

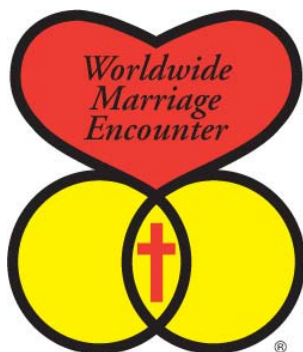

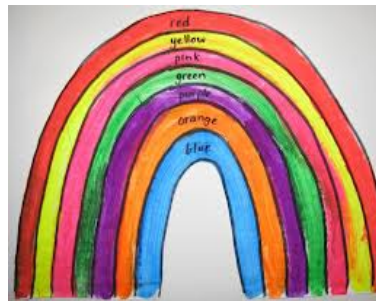
Happy September! The 2013-2014 brings the beginning of our 43rd year of ministry into the community.

Wanderers

Friday, September 20 the Wanderers journey to Colorado Springs to view "Passages" a touring exhibition that employs whiz-bang technology such as holograms and animatronics to explain the Bible. Hundreds of artifacts and texts from the Jewish, Catholic, Protestant and Orthodox faith traditions, including cuneiform tablets dating to the time of Abraham, first century B.C. Dead Sea Scroll fragments, first editions of the King James Bible and Torah scrolls that survived the Nazi Holocaust are featured. Depart Mount Olive at 8:30 AM and return approximately 5 PM. We'll visit the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and Museum of the American Cowboy before going to lunch at Patty Jewett Golf Course Restaurant. Cost of \$40 includes transportation, admissions, and lunch.
