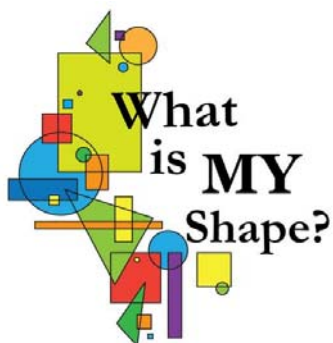

Men, Yes, But More Accurately, God At Work.

(Read I Corinthians 2:1-16, 3:1-9)

I received a compliment on the sermon that I gave today. It is nice to hear kind and laudatory words for the work that one does. It can be easy for me to take some of the credit for the words delivered to the hearers today. Yet, I am not the author nor the doer of the words delivered. As a preacher of God's Word it is important for me to remember (and for the hearers to remember) that God is the Author behind these words and the Doer of the task of gaining our salvation. God is my Creator and the One who gives me life day by day and moment by moment. He gives me my intellect, my health, my faith, etc., etc. He authors the message and calls and equips workers to broadcast what He has done for sinners in Christ.



I planted,
Apollos watered,
but God
gave the growth.

1 Corinthians 3:6, NRSV

The Apostle Paul wrote to the believers in Corinth, Greece, a congregation that faced all kinds of challenges. In this parish many members loved to identify with Paul and called themselves "I am of Paul." Others, in contrast and contention toward Paul, called themselves, "I am of Apollos." Others, a bit pompously to be sure, said, "No, no, no, but I am of Christ," as they looked down on others.

Paul clarified the matter when he wrote these words, *I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth. So, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth ...* (1 Corinthians 3:6-7).

Similarly, we are in the middle of a transition process between "settled" senior pastors. I have been trained in a process to share with the Transition Team, the leaders, and the parishioners of Mount Olive Lutheran. Phase I – "Telling The Stories Of The Congregation," Phase II – "Getting To Know Our Community," and Phase III – "Planning For Future Ministry" are the components of this process. With the added "50th Anniversary Celebration" events, we will take an additional period of time to tell and celebrate our congregation's stories. What a milestone we are observing! The 50th year anniversary and a transition process! We are busy carrying out the activities of this anniversary and this process. We are busy working.

However, God is at work, not just men (intentional interim pastor, staff, men, women, children, etc.). God is in this! God is God! He will bless us according to

His best will for us. Can you see what He has done? Can you see what He is doing? He promises to keep on carrying on in the reclaiming of sinners from the darkness and shining light, life, and love into their souls. Jesus has made this possible.

It is obvious that Jesus lives in the hearts of the members of Mount Olive Lutheran. Even as we walk through this time of celebrating a special anniversary and of this process of the intentional interim period, may we be in awe of what God is doing, thank Him, trust Him, and continue to follow Him and hope in Him.

Before sinners had a clue, God planned to send His Son to win our salvation. Before we are aware of the blessings of this time of transition, God is busy working good to us and through us to others. All glory be to His name!

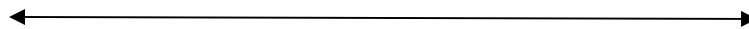

This year our cookie cans will be sent out on these Saturdays: 2014-October 4, November 1, December 6, and 2015-February 7, March 7 and April 4. On these days a coffee can filled with home-baked cookies, hot cocoa or cider mix and seasonal goodies will be mailed or delivered to each college student. Parents or students of Mount Olive submit student names and addresses each year to receive the cookie can.

If you or your child would like to receive a can, ESPECIALLY THE NEW JUNE, 2014 GRADUATES, please submit the name and address to Kathy Pelechchan, 303.693.4161 OR kpelechchan@msn.com by September 26 for the October 4 mailing.

We are asking that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 2-1/2 dozen cookies for each can, so your help is needed and greatly appreciated. If you just love to bake, we would also welcome and appreciate your contribution too!

Ways to be involved:

- ⇒ Bake cookies, wrap them in packs of two with cling wrap or in a snack-size baggie and bring them to church for packing.
- ⇒ Donate cocoa, cider mix, seasonal candy, granola bars, popcorn, pretzels, cheese crackers, nuts, raisins and other dried fruits, trail mix, rice cakes, Crystal Lite, cider, hot chocolate, ice tea and other drink packets, etc., **STARTING SEPTEMBER 15, PLEASE!!!**
- ⇒ Donate for mailing costs. There is a coffee can on the Book Rack table.
- ⇒ Come and help pack. It takes less than an hour and we have a great time working together and catching up on what our college kids are doing.



Several 'thank you' notes and emails were received from students last year letting us know how much they enjoyed the cans of goodies and how it "gave them a nice break" from their studies to enjoy a "taste of home".

We hope to have around 20 cans this year and at 2-1/2 dozen cookies per can we will need about 50 dozen cookies each month. If you have 2 lb or 3 lb coffee cans with lids, drop them off in the church front closet please! Students living at home can have their cookie can hand delivered but postage for the 'at school' group runs between \$7.50-\$8.50 depending on the size of the can. Monetary donations are accepted at any time and are GREATLY APPRECIATED. They can be given to the Church Office or placed in the cookie can on the Book Rack table.

Your Contributions at Work

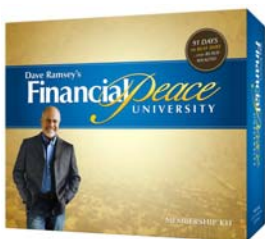
As we bring to close our fiscal year that ended June 30, here is a recap of the facilities projects we were able to complete over the past 12 months. These were all made possible by your pledges and special gifts dollars throughout the year.

- ECEC restroom remodel, new carpeting, and new exterior doors (providing better security) to the playground area
- Improvements to Fellowship Hall
 - ⇒ A/V upgrade for better sound and video projection
 - ⇒ Solar window shades replacing old drapery
 - ⇒ Multi-purpose counter and storage unit
 - ⇒ Air Conditioning
- Improvements to Kitchen
 - ⇒ Countertop replacement
 - ⇒ Ice maker
 - ⇒ New freezer
- Roof work – work was completed on the sloped roofs of Fellowship Hall and the Sanctuary. (90% of the cost covered by insurance)
- Emergency lights and exit lights replaced with new LED fixtures
- Various deferred maintenance items completed as well as some current deficiencies
- Executed contract for a major upgrade of the Sanctuary sound system (scheduled completion 9/1/14)

All these items helped improve our church and school facilities from an appearance/upkeep, functionality, and building/equipment infrastructure standpoints. Thanks to all for helping keep God’s house in order!

Wanderers

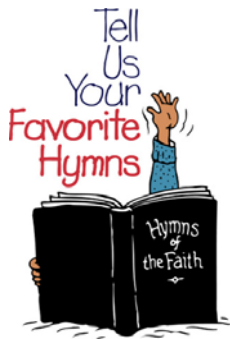
