## Winter Bible Studies

### Beginning Sunday, January 5/12, 9:30 AM

**Turning Points** – Beginning January 5 and continue for six weeks learning and discussion about the work of God in His church since its founding. Important moments include Luther's appearance at the Diet of Worms, English Act of Supremacy, Counter Reformation, Rise of Pietism, French Revolution, and further turning points in the twentieth century. The class will include video presentations, readings and discussions of God's work in the present time.

**Faithweaver Adult Class** – Following the lessons of the children's Sunday School, this class for all adults, is designed to be a little more interactive as we dive into the Bible stories and apply them to our lives. Most of the Bible stories tie into what the lessons are in worship for a particular Sunday! Meeting in the Fellowship Hall.

**Study of Luke** – Beginning on Sunday, January 12, you are invited to study the Gospel of Luke (location to be announced). Luke has been called a historian of the first order and his Gospel is recognized by many as one of the most beautiful books ever written. Luke does not merely chronicle facts; his heart is aglow as he leads from one episode to another. Luke follows Jesus' earthly life from birth to death and many events in between which are universally admired and loved. For instance, the Good Samaritan, the Prodigal Son, the Pharisee and the Tax Collector, Zacchaeus and more. There is no homework. 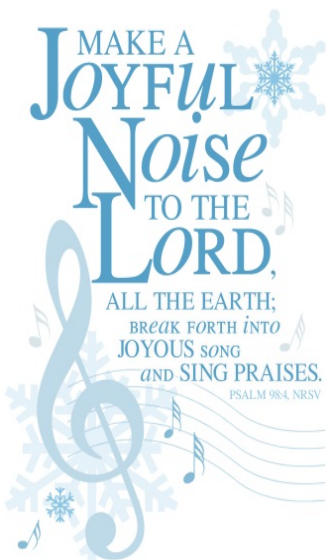
#### **Chancel Choir**

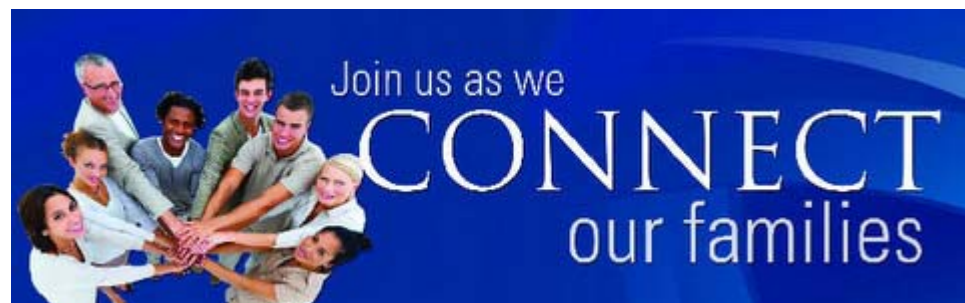
*The Legacy Journey* classes meet for around an hour and a half each week for seven weeks at 7 PM and will start on January 9, 2014.

2014 is here and we're ready for a GREAT year!

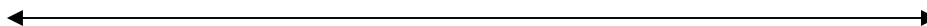
Last month was filled with much fun! We enjoyed Jesus' birthday party, singing of Christmas carols, our program for our families and parties where there was much celebrating. The children brought in 70 boxes of cereal. WOW! All the cereal was donated to Aurora Interchurch to feed families in need. It took four BIG trash bags to deliver them. Thank you to Leo Greunke for delivering the cereal for us.

Pastor Wolfmueller from Hope Lutheran Church will lead us in chapel on January 15 and 16. The children love going to God's house and learning more about Him.

Our church body began in 1847 with 12 churches and 14 schools. Today we have over 6,100 churches and 2,400 schools. There are approximately 250,000 children in Lutheran schools hearing of God's love and saving grace every-day. At our ECEC we have 95 children and families. We pray the young believers in our care grow in their faith, moving on to become disciples of Jesus Christ. Some may ask the questions, "Are Lutheran schools still worth all the money?" Maybe the question needs to be, "Are our children worth the money spent on Lutheran schools?"

This month we celebrate National Lutheran Schools Week with Lutheran schools all across the country from January 27-February 2. Join us as we celebrate God's blessings through our schools! Some of our celebrations this week include **Crazy Hat Day!** We will wear our craziest hat and go on a hat parade! We also celebrate with V.I.P (Very Important Person) Day. Every child invites one adult friend to join us at school. We will paint, read stories, explore our classroom, and make lots of **FUN** memories together. We will end our special time together with a program in the Fellowship Hall. The children will sing for their V.I.P. and share a snack together made especially by the children. What a celebration week we will have!

Since 1972, our ministry through the ECEC has touched approximately 4,450 children with the Word of God. We thank God for giving us this mission field!



## Have You Noticed the New Logo? *Pastor Borgstede*



Over the last two months we have worked with Kristin Neuharth to come up with a new logo for Mount Olive. You may have seen it used in our bulletins, December newsletter and on our Website and will definitely see it other places in the future.

Why a new logo when we have the Reach, Care, Build graphic? There are a variety of reasons for a new logo, but the one reason that stands out is we wanted something that could be seen and understood by people outside Mount Olive and would reflect our name and would come to be recognized in our community. The logo, as designed by Kristin is ...

- ⇒ Simple and clean design that can be used in a variety of ways.
- ⇒ Clearly states our name and identity as Lutheran.
- ⇒ Conveys that we are Christ-centered with the prominent cross.
- ⇒ The mountains and olive branch visually create a uniqueness tied to our name and geographic location.

What about the Reach, Care, Build graphic? We have been using this graphic for many years and it will continue to be used to visually convey our mission; what each of us as members strive to do together at Mount Olive. In that sense it is more of an "internal" visual representation of our mission. It is a great graphic but we also recognized that it may mean nothing to someone who has not been a part of our ministry. It may provide a great discussion starter if someone visiting would ask, but if they did not ask they probably would not really know what it meant.

We now have a new logo to be used as a way to "brand" ourselves to the community of Aurora; and the Reach, Care, Build graphic is a visual reminder of our mission together – We are called by God to reach out, care for, and build people toward maturity in Christ.
