

During Lent we will be using portions of the liturgy from *Now the Feast and Celebration* by Marty Haugen.

Now the Feast and Celebration was commissioned by the campus ministry and worship community of Pacific Lutheran University,

Tacoma, Washington in the early 1990s. As described in the introduction, "Now the Feast and Celebration is an alternative musical setting for the eucharist employing language which attempts to be inclusive and contemporary while retaining a Christo-centered theology and a form which respects traditional practice."

It was last used here at Mount Olive over ten years ago and was well received at the time.
