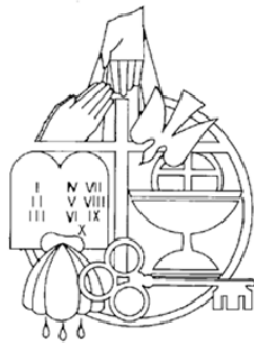

This summer, adults (singles, couples, parents, grandparents, adults with no children or furry children), little children, big children, and grandchildren are invited to share your stories. ## Transition Means Change

(Read Exodus 14:5; I Corinthians 15:51)

May is upon us. The seasons are changing. Soon, the vegetation will be green (changing) getting ready for summer. The school year is coming to a close (is transitioning, changing) and the season of vacations is beginning again.

Summer time vacations and activities are around the corner. May, itself, finds us celebrating the various changes of life, Confirmation, graduations, weddings, etc.

Changes can usher in good or bad. The change itself, however, is not the good or bad thing.

In the Old Testament, the “Pharaoh had a change of heart...” after letting the children of Israel go. He then pursued them with his army (Exodus 14:5), but God protected them and went with them. In the New Testament, the Apostle Paul taught the Corinthian believers about the ‘ultimate change’ on the Final Day. “... we will all be changed ... in the twinkling of an eye at the last trumpet ...” (I Corinthians 15:51-52).

Life is filled with changes. Many can be difficult and bring pain. Others can usher into our lives much joy and goodness.

As you read these words Mount Olive’s “Transition Team” has begun its work. This team will work with Pastor Patterson in order to lead the saints of Mount Olive Lutheran through a process of transition during this time of change.

The God who has created us, redeemed us, and renews us, daily, with His love and forgiveness is walking with us during this time of transition.

Soon, we shall begin our walk through Phase I. In this phase, we will find different ways to ‘tell the stories of Mount Olive Lutheran Church, going way back to the beginning of this congregation’s history, our church body’s history, and the beginning of the Christian Church. We will, indeed, see our Lord’s hand walking us through all kinds of circumstances.

Then, in Phase II, we will take a closer look just at where God has placed us here in the Aurora, east metro area. We will undertake the task of knowing our community better, as it is now and where it seems to be headed.

Finally, in Phase III, we will plan out our path forward, with faith in the Lord, and set specific ministry goals that we will become convinced of that the Lord would have us do.

The One who changes hearts with repentance and faith; the One whose goodness, mercy, and truth never change; will be with you and me during this Transition.

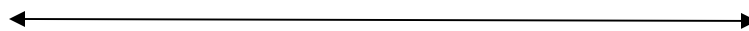

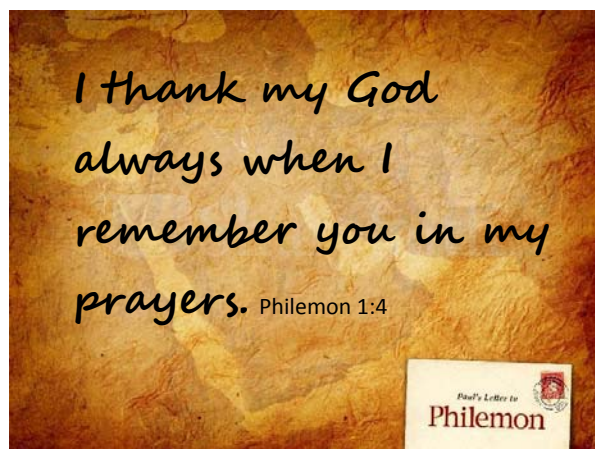

## Endowment Fund

Kristin Matasovsky, Tyler Stibrich, and Rev. Charles Ferry and family are the Mount Olive Endowment Fund's current grantees.

**Kristin** is a Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Globally Engaged in Outreach Missionary serving as a teacher in a Christian primary school in South Africa. Kristin wrote to us: "I have 24 Grade 3 students in my class this year. ... Our school has been blessed with the addition of a Grade 7 class, two more classrooms and a larger administration office. We have right around 300 students. Please pray that my students will grow academically and spiritually."



**Tyler** is serving with Damasccas Road Tuscon, a campus based church at the University of Arizona. It is part of the Campus Ambassadors, a ministry of Missions Door. He helps UA students grow spiritually, build community, and worship and pray together. Tyler asks us to pray for those students who are searching for direction from God in their lives.

**Rev. Ferry, his wife Cheryl, and their four children** (Caleb, 8; Caitlin, 4; Carissa, 2; and baby Cassandra, born February 6, 2014) have been called to serve on behalf of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Southern Asia. In this role, Charles seeks to build and maintain relationships between the LCMS and local church bodies. He facilitates fellowship talks, provides pastoral development for local pastors and teaches at the local seminary as needed. In addition, Charles provides Word and Sacrament ministry as needed, especially to geographically separated Lutherans.

All children, age 3-grade 5 are invited to participate in Kid's Club. Children will be playing outdoors if the weather permits.

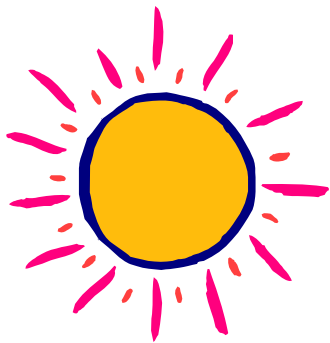

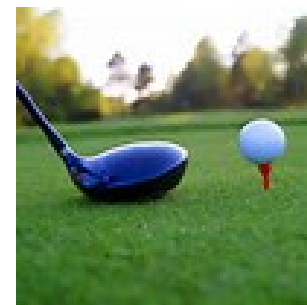

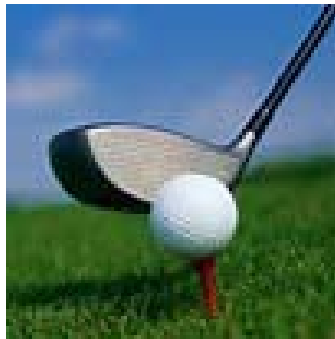
