Forgive Us, Lord

(Read Matthew 6:12)

The older that I get, the more I desire to change one certain petition of the Lord's Prayer. That petition is, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." The longer I live, the more I disappoint myself with my sinful lack of readiness to forgive others. I think to myself, "If the Lord forgives me like I forgive others, then I'm up a creek without a paddle." Rather, Lord, teach me to forgive others like You forgive me!

Easily, I can find myself thinking very unkind thoughts toward the person in the car ahead of me, or the person who jumped in line in front of me at the store, or the person who, seemingly, ignored me when they were supposed to pay attention to me, etc., etc. The amount of ill feelings toward others that I, potentially, can pile up in a day's time is enormous.



Stories are told in many families of relatives that had a dispute many years ago and still are unable to forgive one another. When there is no humbling of oneself, no apologies, no repentance expressed, the wall of un-forgiveness remains. The wall seems to grow higher with the passage of time.

Truly, all people need the forgiveness of sins as a primary need every day. Before a holy God, we need forgiveness for our countless and even unknown-to-us sins. Before our loved ones and neighbors, we need the forgiveness of sins in order to continue to function in relationship with them.

Un-forgiveness clogs up the 'human mechanism.' Grudges bog our spirits down. Instead of light-hearted anticipation of seeing someone, the lack of forgiveness brings with it the desire to avoid another person.

Truly, forgiveness is needed by all human beings.

The Bible tells us that "God is love (agape)." In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he writes that 'love (agape) does not keep a record of wrongs.' (I Corinthians 13:5).

The Bible explains that all human beings were created to love God and to love others as themselves. To forgive another's "trespasses against us" is part and parcel to loving that person. Love and forgiveness go together. Indeed to love even ourselves, we need to forgive ourselves just as God forgives us because of Christ's sacrifice for us.

The Apostle Paul who reminds us that it is God, the Holy Spirit, who equips us with His mercy-filled kind of love with which we can forgive like He forgives (Romans 5:5). Thanks be to God!

On these days a coffee can filled with home-baked cookies, hot cocoa or cider mix and seasonal goodies will be mailed or delivered to each college student. Parents or students of Mount Olive submit student names and addresses each year to receive the cookie can.

If you or your child would like to receive a can, ESPECIALLY THE NEW JUNE 2014 GRADUATES, please submit the name and address to Kathy Pelepchan, 303.693.4161 OR kpelepchan@msn.com by September 26 for the October 4 mailing.

We are asking that each family submitting a name help with the project for at least one of the months in which the cans are mailed. It takes about 2-1/2 dozen cookies for each can, so your help is needed and greatly appreciated. If you just love to bake, we would also welcome and appreciate your contribution too!

Ways to be involved:

- ⇒ Bake cookies, wrap them in packs of two with cling wrap or in a snack-size baggie and bring them to church for packing.
- ⇒ Donate cocoa, cider mix, seasonal candy, granola bars, popcorn, pretzels, cheese crackers, nuts, raisins and other dried fruits, trail mix, rice cakes, Crystal Lite, cider, hot chocolate, ice tea and other drink packets, etc., **STARTING SEPTEMBER 15**, **PLEASE!!!**
- ⇒ Donate for mailing costs. There is a coffee can on the Book Rack table.
- ⇒ Come and help pack. It takes less than an hour and we have a great time working together and catching up on what our college kids are doing.



Several 'thank you' notes and emails were received from students last year letting us know how much they enjoyed the cans of goodies and how it "gave them a nice break" from their studies to enjoy a "taste of home".

We hope to have around 20 cans this year and at 2-1/2 dozen cookies per can we will need about 50 dozen cookies each month. If you have 2 lb or 3 lb coffee cans with lids, drop them off in the church front closet please! Students living at home can have their cookie can hand delivered but postage for the 'at school' group runs between \$7.50-\$8.50 depending on the size of the can. Monetary donations are accepted at any time and are GREATLY APPRECIATED. They can be given to the Church Office or placed in the cookie can on the Book Rack table.


NEW "YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY" TEAM



- The early 1980's were filled with Sports teams at Mount Olive. There were 5 Sunday afternoon softball teams. Two Men's teams, two Women's teams and a Youth team. The teams won several League Championships.
- Pastor Brockmann was the pitcher for the Men's "Blue" softball team.
- There also was a Mount Olive 9:00 PM Sunday night bowling league with about 40 bowlers participating.
- A group of over 20 Mount Olive Youth and Counselors attended the National Youth Gathering in San Antonio, Texas in 1983. That was the first time our Youth Group attended the National gathering.
- In 1984, a Monday evening church service was held during the summer and a 9:30 AM Sunday morning service was added.
- By 1985 the congregation had grown to 1500 baptized members.
