This fall Mount Olive will begin a church-wide Bible study based on a book called *The Story*. *The Story* presents the Bible in an abridged, chronological form and reveals the way the whole Bible fits together in a single grand narrative. This narrative is divided into 31 easy-to-read chapters that reveals God’s grace in creation, in His love for His people Israel, in His love for us through the ministry and sacrifice of His Son Jesus, in His care of the early Church, and finally in His revelation of the end times.

We will begin in September 2015 and will continue until May 2016. Each week the entire church—adults, youth, confirmation class and children will be covering the same chapter using their own age-appropriate versions of *The Story*, and it will also be the theme for our worship services and sermons.

What a great opportunity for EVERYONE to be on the “same page” as we dig into God’s Word for 31 weeks!!

For adults a study on *The Story* will be offered every week during the Sunday school hour, but additionally we will offer this Bible study in a more informal small group setting. These small groups can choose to meet on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly schedule. If you are interested in participating in this Bible study or would consider hosting one of these small groups, there is a sign-up sheet at the ARK.

Over 4,600 people attended the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) Convention in Des Moines, Iowa, June 25-28, under the theme "Bountiful! Sow, Nourish, Reap." The

convention theme was based on the Scripture passage: *And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work* (2 Corinthians 9:8 NIV). The LWML is the official women's auxiliary of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS).



Jennifer Weber from Mount Olive was one of two Young Women Representatives from the Rocky Mountain District. Jennifer joined over 70 other young women throughout the LWML Districts.

Delegates to the 36th Biennial Convention of the LWML adopted a historic \$2 million mission goal for the 2015-2017 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 19 mission grants as men and women respond in prayers and offerings during the next two years.

Philip the Evangelist. The name gives away the end of the story doesn't it? Philip, who works in the Jerusalem church 'waiting tables' (Acts 6:2-6), nevertheless becomes famous for boldly sharing the Word of God. "Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Rise and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." And there was an Ethiopian, a eunuch, a court official who had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning, seated in his chariot. The Spirit said to Philip, "Go over and join this chariot." So Philip ran to him" (Acts 8).

Although he has never been formally trained, Philip doesn't hesitate to run up to the man at the Lord's urging and tell him what he knows. And what Philip knows is Jesus. "Then Philip opened his mouth, and he told him the good news about Jesus. And as they were going along the road they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "See, here is water! What prevents me from being baptized?" (Acts 8)

Philip listens to God. Philip opens his mouth. Another man's name is written in the Book of Life! Whatever else you and I know, we know Jesus. God invites us to open our mouths and tell people what we know. God especially invites you and me to open our mouths and invite people here, to Mount Olive Lutheran Church where God's all powerful Word is clearly spoken, His Word is combined with the water of life and the bread of forgiveness, the very body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

At the end of the story, the Spirit whisks Philip away to another place to proclaim the Good News. Just last week, I was the Vacancy Pastor at Concordia Lutheran Church, Steamboat Springs, but the Spirit has whisked *me* away and this week I have the privilege and the joy of joining all of you in proclaiming the life giving Word to the people of Aurora. I am Pastor Robert Harmon. Diana and I live in Aurora where she teaches deaf children at Lansing Elementary. Our kids, Emily and Chris, attend UNC Greeley and CU Denver, respectively. Thank you for allowing us to share in God's ministry here at Mount Olive!

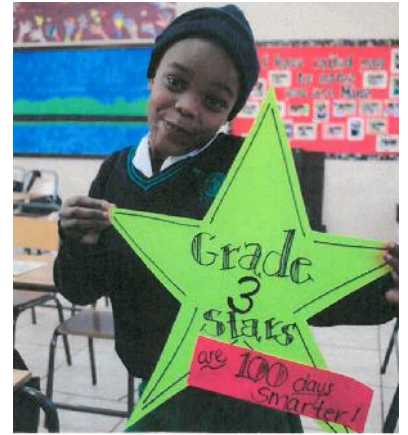

LCMS YOUTH GATHERING

From July 16-20, 2016, thousands of Lutheran Christian students and leaders will gather in New Orleans for a national youth gathering. Held every three years since 1980, the LCMS Youth Gathering provides thousands of youth and adults the opportunity to come together as a community of God's people to learn more about Jesus Christ, the Christian faith and their Lutheran identity.

During the five days of the Gathering, youth spend time together in God's word, worship, service and fellowship with others from across the Synod. This event is organized by LCMS Youth Ministry in Saint Louis, MO.

Beginning with the orientation meeting on July 12, at 10:45 AM we have been working with families of students so they can attend this fantastic event. The gathering theme is based upon Philippians 1:3-5: **I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.**

For youth that will be 14 years old at the time of the Gathering OR entering his or her ninth grade year at the time of the Gathering.

- Total church operating revenues were below our budgeted projections by just over \$52,000. This represented a pattern of reduced revenues throughout the fiscal year. On the plus side, our overall expenses were less (better) than anticipated, so even with the reduced revenues we came out ahead.
- The value of the endowment fund at 6/30/15 was \$187,669. This was a slight net market value decrease for the fiscal year. The decrease was the result of \$6,460 in contributions, \$5,000 in grant disbursements, and the unrealized losses due to market fluctuations in the investment portfolio.
- “Your Pledge and Special Gifts Dollars at Work”. From a facilities perspective, the following was accomplished:
 - ⇒ Landscaping around the South side of the facility. Done as part of our 50th Anniversary celebration. Funded through special gifts.
 - ⇒ Sanctuary sound system. Funded through special gifts.
 - ⇒ Replacement of 2 sewage ejector pumps located in the ECEC area. Both units were the original ones from 1977.
 - ⇒ Replaced Sanctuary can incandescent lights with LED bulbs.
 - ⇒ Retrofitted the Iliff Avenue and main entry doors off the south parking lot with new hardware/closing mechanisms. The existing pneumatic in ground closers became problematic and inoperable.
 - ⇒ Retrofitted the fluorescent light fixtures in the church offices to accommodate more energy efficient lights.
 - ⇒ Iliff Avenue parking lot was repaired, resealed, and restriped.
 - ⇒ Improved the “Wi-Fi” coverage within the complex, including the ECEC.
