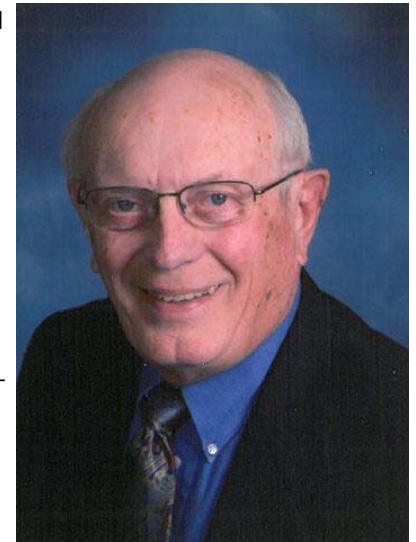

... That I May By All Means Save Some

(Read I Corinthians 9:19-23)

In the novel "Hawaii" written by James Michner, the author describes a few bold, albeit inexperienced and naïve, missionaries from New England who make the dangerous trek from New England, by ship, to the Hawaiian Islands in order to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to people who do not know of Jesus the Savior. To be sure, the rigid customs and inability to live and function as the native peoples, posed an almost insurmountable barrier for these well-meaning missionaries. What barriers do we face here today in Aurora, Colorado as we attempt to share the Good News of Jesus?

As we enter Phase II ("Getting To Know Our Community"), we are indeed missionaries to many who do not know Jesus. The people who live in Aurora and the east metro area of Denver may have had good, bad, or no experiences with organized religion. They may be looking for help in living their lives or not. Whatever their circumstance in life, we, as God's children in this place at this time, have been given this opportunity to share the "Good News" of God giving to sinners a Savior who is Christ the Lord.

There may be cultural behaviors, preferences, and or unique attitudes or traditions of the people who live in or come to this community. As we get to know our neighbor better and better, may we find ways to share the Good News of sins forgiven with those around us. May we find ways to "speak their language," to "connect" with their interests, to be in their world with them in order to truly care for them.

The Apostle Paul encountered many different cultures and peoples. As he did so, he learned this wisdom that he shared with the Corinthians, "For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a slave to all, that I might win the more. And to the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might win Jews; to those who are under the Law, as under the Law, though not being myself under the Law, that I might win those who are under the Law; to those who are without law, as without law, though not being without the law of God, but under the law of Christ, that I might win those who are without law. To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak; I have become all things to all men, that I may by all means save some. And I do all things for the sake of the Gospel, that I may become a fellow partaker of it" (I Corinthians 9:19-23). The same Holy Spirit that equipped Paul will equip us (See Romans 5:5 and Galatians 5:22-23).

May our Lord Jesus bless us in Phase II as we get to know our community just a bit better. May He equip us to be all things to all people (in Aurora and the surrounding area). And may some more souls, by all means, be saved as they, too, come to know and believe in Jesus Christ, the very Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, and gives eternal life to all those who, by the working of the Holy Spirit, believe in Him.

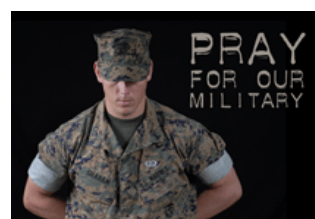

February Family Service Club

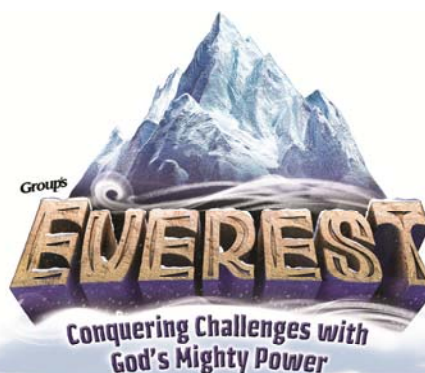
February 8, 11:45 AM

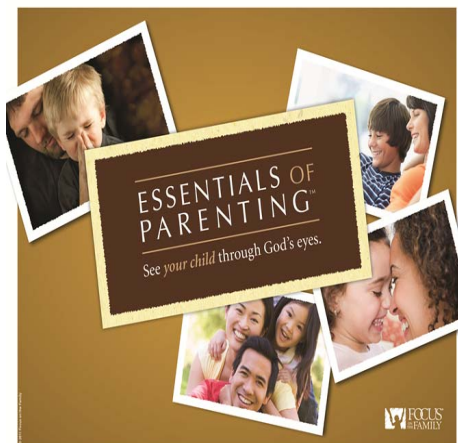

- ⇒ Pastor Michael Borgstede joined the Mount Olive staff in 2000 as our Assistant Pastor. His installation took place in October.
- ⇒ Brent Howard was called to be our new DCE also in 2000.
- ⇒ In 2001, the Head to Heart confirmation program began. This program is a family based program.
- ⇒ 2001 is also the 30th anniversary of the ECEC program. At this time there were over 150 students enrolled in Preschool, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes.
- ⇒ 2004 in Mount Olive's 40th anniversary. In 40 years the state and the city have grown as has the Mount Olive family. Over the years Aurora has grown from 48,000 people to 276,000. The congregation has grown now to over 1600 baptized members and 1300 communicants.
- ⇒ Also in 2004 Mount Olive was invited by a land developer through the Rocky Mountain District, to receive 11 acres of land 17 miles south and east of our current location with the desire that this opportunity would allow Mount Olive to further the mission of Christ's Great Commission.
